RE: Charter Schools Information Update – January 2006

The attached chart updates the document originally submitted by Dr. Kaplan, as requested by David Harrell on December 22, 2005. Charter schools were asked to verify information and edits were based on their response. Other edits were made; this report:

- Adds the name of the school district.
- Indicates who the contact person is (e.g., Principal or Founder). The new schools that have not yet opened the doors to students will not likely have a principal drawing a salary.
- Adds the name of one governing council member—most likely the president. We do not collect the names of all governing council members.
- Clarifies the enrollment by grade and projected enrollment for schools that have not yet opened.
- Adds the annual lease payment for 2005-06 and the Lease Assistance Award granted by the Public Schools Facility Authority. We do not collect the names of landlords, so the chart does not identify private landlords by name nor does it provide information on foundation support (again, this information is not collected by the PED).
- The section on state funding has been “cleaned up” so that it should be obvious how much state revenue the school receives as part of the State Equalization Guarantee (SEG), State Stimulus for Charter Schools, or Lease Assistance Payment. Please keep in mind that the State Stimulus is a one-time grant to newly-approved schools. Included in the chart is the amounts disbursed during the 2004-05 and 2005-06, so many will not have a state stimulus amount, and the total amount of state stimulus funds will not add-up to a particular year’s appropriation.

- I did not edit the Federal Revenue sections, which indicate the Year-to-Date amounts of Federal Charter School funds granted to the school. So, for example, Sidney Gutierrez Middle School received a total of \$450,000 over three years which ended in 2002.
