BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

SB241SECa/SPAC/a

- 1. amends Senate Education Committee amendments 2 through 5 by striking through them;**
- 2. replaces “performing and visual” with “fine” on page 1, line 13;**
- 3. deletes the word “national” on page 1, line 14; and**
- 4. deletes the language “standards and to require the revision and updating of the physical education standards as nationally recognized standards evolve and change” from page 1, lines 14-16.**
- 5. deletes “based on nationally recognized standards for dance, media arts, music, theater and visual arts” on page 2, lines 5-7**
- 6. deletes Section B “the department shall update physical education standards in department rule to reflect current nationally recognized standards and practices and regularly revise and update physical education content standards as they change” from page 2, lines 9-13.**

SB241SEC amends the language on page 2, line 5 by inserting the word “fine” in front of “arts”; on page 2, line 5, strikes through, “based on nationally recognized standards for dance, media arts, music, theater and visual arts”; and on page 2, line 9 strikes through Section B, “The department shall update physical education content standards in department rule to reflect current nationally recognized standards and practices and regularly revise and update physical education content standards as they change.”

Senate Bill 241 (SB241) amends the Public School Code to require PED to adopt academic content and performance standards for performing and visual arts and national physical education standards and to require the revision and updating of the physical education standards as nationally recognized standards evolve and change.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The adoption of new content standards generally requires substantial financial resources be invested in curricular resources/instructional materials, teacher professional development, and new assessment tools (from blueprints to item development). While generating an estimate

would require additional planning time, there would be potential costs associated with these adoptions that the state and local districts have not anticipated to-date.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

SB241SECa/SPAC/a

The SPAC amendment, as did the SEC amendment, expands the core subjects for which PED would be required to adopt academic content and performance standards.

New Mexico has standards adopted for physical education and visual and performing arts. The amendment removes the restrictive language from the bill specifying that “nationally recognized standards and practices” be adopted. There are no significant changes from the SEC amendment.

SB241SEC amends the language on page 2, line 5 by inserting the word “fine” in front of “arts”; on page 2, line 5, strikes through, “based on nationally recognized standards for dance, media arts, music, theater and visual arts”; and on page 2, line 9 strikes through Section B, “The department shall update physical education content standards in department rule to reflect current nationally recognized standards and practices and regularly revise and update physical education content standards as they change.”

The bill expands the core subjects for which PED would be required to adopt academic content and performance standards, although, PED already has standards adopted for physical education and visual and performing arts. The amendment removes the restrictive language from the bill specifying that “nationally recognized standards and practices” be adopted.

SB241 requires PED to adopt academic content and performance standards for arts and physical education.

PED continues to collaborate with educators in both of the fields outlined in SB241, as well as the broader New Mexico education community, in reviewing available options and considering all implications of adopting new standards.
